



### LET'S MAKE BLUE PINWHEELS!



In 2008, Prevent Child Abuse America® introduced the **blue pinwheel** as the national symbol for child abuse prevention.

Because by its very nature, the pinwheel connotes playfulness, joy, and childhood, it has come to serve as a physical reminder of the great childhoods we want for all children.

### **ACTIVITY**

Help create awareness by teaching your kids or students how to make blue pinwheels. Remind children that God created them to be happy, healthy, and safe.

# LET'S MAKE BLUE PINWHEEL GARDENS!



The Office of Child and Youth Protection in the Diocese of San Bernardino encourages parishes and schools to create Blue Pinwheel Gardens to:

- Remind children that God created them to be happy, healthy, and safe.
- Teach children that if anyone makes them feel scared, uncomfortable, or confused, they have the right to Say No, Get Away or Tell A Trusted Adult, and It Is Never Their Fault!
- Start a conversation with students, parents, and staff on child abuse prevention.

### **ACTIVITY**

Invite the children to place a pinwheel in their parish/school garden or yard at home.













## LET'S MAKE BLUE PINWHEEL WALLS!



The Office of Child and Youth Protection in the Diocese of San Bernardino encourages parishes and schools to create "Blue Pinwheel Walls".

### **ACTIVITY**

Invite the children to create a "Blue Pinwheel Wall" in their classroom or home.

## LET'S MAKE CARDBOARD KIDS!



**Help create self-awareness and self-appreciation** by having students and children making a "cardboard-kid" of themselves.


### **ACTIVITY**

- 1. Cut out cardboard in the shape of a child. You may use the template on the next page.
- 2. Have the children dress up and decorate their Cardboard-Kid any way they choose.
- 3. Place the Cardboard-Kids in the class rooms and throughout the school/parish/home.









### LET'S WEAR BLUE ON FRIDAYS!

**Help create awareness** at your parish or school by inviting students and staff to wear blue on Fridays during the month of April (or any other day of the week).

## MORE IDEAS AND RESOURCES FOR APRIL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH



- Have students and staff wear blue ribbons throughout the month of April.

  Wearing the blue ribbon is a visual way for individuals to demonstrate that they are taking a stand against child abuse and encouraging others to do the same.
- Invite a speaker to talk about child abuse prevention and reporting.
- Offer or review safe environment training for students and children.
- Offer parents resources on child abuse prevention (see the resource list below).
- Have a special mass for child abuse prevention and victims at your parish.
